LINCOLN HILL HIGH SCHOOL



Houses three different programs

• 6.4 FTE, .6 of which support ALE.



SARATOGA SCHOOL



- Parent Partnership ALE where our students' parents are the primary educators.
- Staff serve as both teachers and consultants for parents and students.
- 6.0 FTE (8 Teachers) serving ~239 FTE (263 headcount) students for the 2021 - 2022 year.

WRITTEN STUDENT LEARNING PLAN: A PLAN TO GUIDE INSTRUCTION AND LEARNING

Lincoln Hill:

- Developed by student and teacher
- Based upon transcript evaluation, graduation plan, credits/competencies to meet graduation requirements
- High School and Beyond Plan

Saratoga:

- Developed by certificated teacher and parent
 - Primary responsibility of the Saratoga teacher
- Based upon grade level and educational plan
- Final approval by the certificated teacher



STUDENT SUPERVISION AND EVALUATION

Weekly Check-In:

- Accomplished via face-to-face (or Google meet for those that wish) meeting for minimum of 1 hour per week.
- Weekly on-site enrichment and core classes at Saratoga.



Monthly Progress Review:

- Learning Progress reviewed monthly by certificated teacher
- Student learning schedules may be accelerated, maintained, or modified to promote success
- Students access state and local assessments

ALTERNATIVE LEARNING EXPERIENCE PROGRAMS SUPPORT OVERALL GOALS FOR ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- Focus on standards and grade level expectations
- Provide learning options for students
- Offer high quality courses
- Provide alternative to traditional route
- Keep students engaged with schooling and on path to graduation
